23. Extension Acivities during the period:

Major Activities during the Period in the sphere of extension activities are:

- 1. As a result of the initiative of the College Administration, Ms. Sangita Gohain Baruah of Mathematics Department has agreed to continue her sponsorship of the salaries of two staff members of Snehalaya (A school for physically challenged children).

Special classes have been organized for Secondary level schools with our faculty members as resource persons.

A Summer Camp for Higher Secondary Students of the college has been organized in the college campus during 01-15 July, 2017.

During 17-22 July, 2017 another Summer Exposure Camp has been organized where 73 students from four different schools along with the students of Womens College, Tinsukia participated (for Arts and Commerce stream separately).

A Summer Residential Exposure Camp for Higher Secondary (Science) Students has been organized in the college campus during 19-27 July, 2017 where 34 students have participated.

- 3. The college has adopted an Old Age Home (Aamar Ghar). The principal, faculties and other staff of the college used to visit the home time to time and help the inmates of the home by providing physical/mental/material support.
- 4. The Mobile Library facilities offered by the college for various schools in the district have been upgraded and policy has been adopted to lend books at the door steps of the beneficiaries. Being one of the best practices of the institution, it has benefitted around 400 students of various schools of the region.
- 5. The college has adopted four High/Higher Secondary Schools from the neighboring rural areas Viz. Jatiya Vidyalaya, Gelapukhuri, Bengmara Jatiya Vidyalaya (From the private Sector), Durgabari Sishu Vidyalaya and Tinsukia Bengali Girls Higher Secondary School (Govt. Provincialised) for their all round academic development through constant educational monitoring and dissemination of knowledge.
- 6. The College has adopted the Goriating village under Hapjaan Block of Tinsukia District. Besides, the NSS Unit of the College also has adopted the same village and the volunteers used to render valuable services for the all round development of the village. The NSS Unit constructed Goriating public library and donated 50 nos. of books to the library for the people of the village.
