Established in 1966, the institution is going to complete fifty-seven years of its glorified existence on July 9, 2023. Having achieved the coveted milestone of successful completion of its Golden journey spanning five decades, the institution has already embarked upon its Diamond journey with vows to achieve greater heights and in this process to render even better services to the society.



### THE GENESIS OF THE COLLEGE

The Women's College, Tinsukia came into being in 1966 on the auspicious day of 9 July. A handful of visionaries' viz. the Late Anath Bandhu Bose, Late Shanti Ranjan Bhattacharjee, Late Prithwish Chandra Bhadury etc. with unstinted support of academicians like Late Subodh Chandra De Sorcar were behind the genesis of the College. Eminent educationist the Late Uma Prasanna Dey was the founder principal of the College with 78 students on roll as the first batch. The auspicious occasion was blessed by the Late Dr. Indira Miri the revered educationist in Assam. At present with the 2(f) and the 12(B) status of the UGC, the College has flourished into a multi faculty institution offering Arts and Commerce programs with almost fifteen hundred students and more than hundred teaching and non-teaching faculty members. A full-fledged study centre of the IGNOU and one Distance Education centre of the Dibrugarh University, housed in the institution, offer various courses at distance mode to aspiring students. Of late a new plot of land has been acquired, where a New Campus is being developed utilizing grants received from the Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan- RUSA.

The College is located at Durgabari (27.4920 $^{\circ}$  N, 95.3537 $^{\circ}$  E), in the heart of Tinsukia, Assam and is well connected by Road, Rail and Airways with the rest of India.



# Academic Aspects

The college is affiliated to the Dibrugarh University and offers Undergraduate Degree Program in CBCS mode, which is of three years duration comprising six semesters. It also offers various Post Graduate Programs of the Dibrugarh University in distance learning mode.

#### **\*** Teaching, Learning and Evaluation:

Teaching - learning at the College is **interactive** and **participatory**. Students are encouraged to participate in the total educational process. Teaching - learning here comprises a variety of activities such as actual contact lectures in the class room (both online & offline), tutorials, discussions, assignments, seminars, library works, field works, projects and presentations by the students. While the Council and the University do the final evaluation, the College does continuous internal evaluation of the students. The overall progress of the student is monitored and remedial measures are taken as per necessity.

#### Academic Calendar:

The college prepares an *Academic Calendar* in consonance with that of the Dibrugarh for every academic session and all the activities of the college are scheduled according to the Academic calendar.

#### Planned Teaching:

Based on the Academic Calendar, Teaching Plans for all the classes are prepared by the Teaching Faculties of the college at the beginning of every session. The emphasis is on timely completion of courses and other activities so as to allow the students sufficient time to prepare for examinations.

#### Remedial Class:

The college makes special arrangements of Remedial Classes for slow learners. Coaching classes are organized for students appearing for various competitive examinations.

#### Four Year Undergraduate Programmes (FYUGP):

The main objectives of the Regulations of Dibrugarh University for the Four Year Undergraduate Programmes (FYUGP) in Choice Based Credit System (CBCS), 2023 are-

- i. To conduct undergraduate programmes—UG Certificate, UG Diploma, Three Year UG Degree, Four Year UG Degree (Honours) and Four Year UG Degree (Honours with Research) in various fields of Study/Discipline as per the guidelines of UGC's Curriculum and Credit Framework in the light of NEP, 2020.
- ii. To provide a multidisciplinary set-up to build vibrant communities of scholars and peers, breakdown harmful silos, enable students to become well rounded across disciplines including artistic, creative, and analytical subjects as well as sports, develop active research communities across disciplines, increase resource efficiency across higher education.
- iii. To nurture avenues for developing holistic individuals through an identified set of skills and values.
- iv. To provide a student centric, flexible, choice based credit framework with multiple entry and exit options so that students can be facilitated to pursue the trail of career chosen by themselves as per their interest.

#### Graduate Attributes

Learning outcomes specific to disciplinary/interdisciplinary areas of learning: Graduates should be able to demonstrate the acquisition of

- i. Comprehensive knowledge and coherent understanding of the chosen disciplinary/interdisciplinary areas of study in a broad multidisciplinary context.
- ii. Practical, professional and procedural knowledge required for carrying out professional or highly skilled work/tasks related to the chosen field of learning.
- iii. Skills in areas related to specialization in the chosen disciplinary/multidisciplinary areas of learning in a broad multidisciplinary context.
- iv. Capacity to extrapolate from what has been learned, translate concepts into real life situations and apply acquired competencies in new/unfamiliar contexts.

#### **Generic learning Outcomes :**

Graduates should be able to demonstrate the capabilities of Complex problem solving, Critical thinking, creativity, communication skills, analytical reasoning, research related skills, coordinating/collaborating with others, leadership readiness/qualities, learning how to learn skills, digital and technological skills, multicultural competence and inclusive spirit, value inculcation, autonomy, responsibility and accountability, environmental awareness and action, community engagement and service and empathy.

# Minimum eligibility criteria for admission in Four Year Undergraduate programmes:

Senior Secondary School Leaving Certificate or Higher Secondary (Class 12) Certificate obtained after successful completion of Grade 12 or equivalent stage of education and/or Common University entrance Test (CUET) conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA) and reservation guidelines of the Govt. of Assam to be followed.

#### **❖** Minimum eligibility criteria for multiple entry points of the UG programmes:

- 1st year: Senior Secondary School Leaving Certificate or Higher Secondary (Class 12) Certificate obtained after successful completion of Grade 12 or equivalent stage of education and/ or Admission test conducted by College/ University/ National Level Testing Agency/ State Level Testing Agency.
- 2nd year: A certificate obtained after successful completion of 1 year (2 semesters) of the undergraduate programme. These students are to take admission in the 2nd year within a period of three years from obtaining the UG certificate from Dibrugarh University or any other University/institution recognized by Dibrugarh University.
- 3rd year: A diploma obtained after successful completion of 2 years (4 semesters) of the undergraduate programme. These students are to take admission in the 3rd year UG programme within a period of three years from obtaining the UG diploma from Dibrugarh University or any other University/institution recognized by Dibrugarh University.
- 4th Year (Honours): A Bachelor's degree after successful completion of three years (6 semesters) of the Undergraduate programme obtained from Dibrugarh University or any other University/institution recognized by Dibrugarh University.
- 4th Year (Honours with Research): A three year Bachelor Degree with a minimum of 7.5 CGPA. The minimum entry requirement for 4th year (Honours/ Research) UG programme within a period of three years from obtaining 3 years Bachelor Degree from Dibrugarh University or any other University/ institution recognized by Dibrugarh University. These students are to complete the degree within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

#### i. Semester Duration:

- Odd Semesters: July–December (including end-semester examinations and semester breaks)
- Even Semester: January-June (including end-semester examinations and semester breaks)
  - A semester consists of approximately 15 weeks/90 working days. One working week will have approximately 40 hours of instructional time. Any change in the Academic Calendar/Schedule may be made by the University whenever necessary.

#### ii. Course Component:

A course may have only a lecture component or a lecture and tutorial component or a lecture and practicum component or a lecture, tutorial and practicum component, or only practicum component. Credit shall be defined as:

#### **\*** Attendance:

A student who has less than 80% attendance in average shall not be permitted to sit for the End-semester examination. However, that it shall be open to the University to grant exemption to a student who has attended a minimum of 70% classes but failed to obtain the prescribed 80% attendance for valid reasons, on recommendation of the Head/Chairperson/Principals of the Department/Centre/College on payment of a prescribed fee(s).

A student declared as dis-collegiate shall not be allowed to proceed to the next higher Semester. He/ she shall need to pursue the Semester afresh in which he/ she was declared as dis-collegiate along with the next fresh batch.

#### **Examination and Evaluation:**

- Examination shall be 20% marks for in-semester assessment and 80% marks for End-semester examination in each course during every semester. A candidate shall be declared as passed a Programme, provided he/ she secure at least 30% of marks in each Course in the End Semester Examinations combining both theory and practical examinations.
- There shall be no provision for re-evaluation of the answer-scripts of the endsemester examinations. However, a candidate may apply for re scrutiny.

#### **End Semester Examination:**

There shall be one End semester examination carrying 80% Marks in each course of a Semester covering the entire syllabus prescribed for the Course. The End semester examination is normally a written/laboratory-based examination/Project Work/Dissertation.

#### **❖** Note:

- Students must complete the degree programme within six years for three year UG programme and seven years for four year UG programme from the dates of admission to the First Semester.
- If students secure a minimum of 52 credits (3-year degree) out of 132 credits and 70 credits (4-year degree) out of 176 credits from any other Core Major to be awarded the UG Degree in relevant Discipline with Double Major and UG Honours/Honours with Research Degree in relevant Discipline with Double Major respectably.
- After a 3-year UG degree students can take admission in the 2-year/4-semester PG degree programme (80 credits).
- After a 4-year UG degree (Honours/ Honours with Research) students can take admission in the 1-year/2-semester PG Diploma programme (40 credits).

After a 3-year UG degree with a 2-year/4-semester PG degree programme, or a 4-year UG degree (Honours) with a 1-year/2-semester PG Diploma programme, or a 4-year UG degree (Honours with Research) students can take admission in the PhD programme.

## Other Aspects

#### **COLLEGE LIBRARY**

Right from the inception of Women's College, Tinsukia the thrust has been on building up a good library both qualitatively and quantitatively which has resulted in a stock of 18,237 Text books, 28,725 Reference Books, 12,942 others and 26 Maps. It also subscribes to 26 Journals & Magazines and 9 News Papers, 273 C.D. & D.V.Ds as on May, 2023. The library has been computerized and Internet facility is available in the library. There is a spacious reading room well-equipped with audio-visual and other modern amenities attached to the library. It is considered a good college library in Assam. It has been rendering services not only to the teachers, students and other staff of the College but to readers from outside of the College also. In addition, the Library provides access to e-journal through the N-List programme.

#### **BOOK BANK FACILITY**

There is provision for **Book Bank** in the college for the benefit of the poor & needy students in the college. It is under the purview of the college Library and has a collection of **4105 books at present**.

#### Beneficiaries :

#### MOBILE LIBRARY

Mobile library is a unique venture of the college library. Under this initiative books are lended to outside academic institutions for free for a certain period of time. It is aimed at providing rich academic resources of the college library at the doorsteps of needy academic institutions and clubs/organizations (registered) of the region.

The College has two Hostels in the College Campus for out-stations students which can accommodate 150 girls. Students have to apply seperately for Hostel accommodation after College admission. Hostel seats are alloted on the basis of merit and as per Govt. Reservaction Rule.

#### **COLLEGE UNIFORM**

White blouse, white mekhela and chadar with sky blue border or white blouse, white saree with sky blue border; alternately, white kamij, white salwar with sky blue scarf. During Winter they may wear navy blue cardigan or blazer. Students must put on the College badge also.

#### N.C.C.

The college has an N.C.C. (Central) wing which has been permitted to accommodate 84 cadets. Willing students should apply for selection into the wing. Certificates are awarded upto 'C' level.

The college has two N.S.S. wings/units under which a number of activities are performed regularly under social extension service programme.
